Faith Under Fire

Lesson #2 (Job's Friends Give Sympathy and Comfort) Job Chapters 4-31

Scripture: 1 John 5:4 "For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world — our faith."

Introduction:

When I was at preaching school we had a long talk one day in class about hospital visits and how important they were because people in the hospital are nervous and usually a bit scared.

One of the most important things we learned was what to say and what not to say. It's amazing how often we can open our mouths and even well intentioned wrong things pour out. For instance, it is never appropriate to talk about death in a hospital to a patient...right?

The most valuable asset you have when visiting someone that is hurting is your ears. But many times we try to offer solutions instead of solace.

Spiritually when we go to someone we must handle it with just as much care. Don't get me wrong we must say what is necessary but with great sensitivity and love.

Encouragement is a fine art, but we all have the ability we must exercise it.

Transitional Statement:

Job's three friends come to comfort and sympathize with Job (2:11). They have three rounds of discussion which we will look at today. When all is said and done God says in Job 42:7 that what the friends said about Him (God) was wrong, while what Job said about God was right.

Satan will use anything to discourage Job and turn him away from God.

Lesson:

I. Eliphaz's (the king of insinuations) makes his assessment of Job's miseries

Chapter 4 (First Speech)

- A. You are impatient 4:5
- B. You need to listen to your own advice 4:3-4
- C. You must be guilty of something 4:7 wrong
- D. Job 4:8 "According to what I have seen, those who plow iniquity And those who sow trouble harvest it."
 - 1. Your getting what you deserve wrong

- E. Worldly wisdom deserts a man when he faces his death. 4:21 wrong
 - 1. Wisdom has fled from you in your present condition
 - 2. Just listen to us and we will instruct you.

Chapter 5 (First Speech Cont.)

- A. God is not listening to you anymore 5:1 wrong
 - 1. And all of heaven has turned their back on you wrong
- B. He implies that Job is a foolish man 5:2-5
 - 1. Overcome by anger and jealousy 5:2
- C. He tells Job that there is a reason for his affliction. 5:6
 - 1. i.e. trouble hasn't just wondered up to your door step
 - 2. You have cultivated it.
- D. You must seek God 5:8
 - 1. You need to stop turning away from Him.
- E. He implies that Job is prideful and shrewd 5:11-12 wrong
- F. And that God causes trouble only for those who are wrong 5:12-13 wrong
- G. "And the unrighteous need to shut their mouths" 5:16
- H. He implies that God is disciplining Job 5:17 wrong
 - 1. And that Job should value His discipline

Chapter 15 (Second speech)

- A. Your words are nothing but wind 15:2
 - 1. Your full of hot air
- B. Your arguments are useless talk 15:3
- C. Your not giving God the right reverence 15:4
 - 1. And it is hindering your relationship with Him
- D. Your words are shaped by guilt and your language is crafty 15:5 wrong
- E. You think you know it all 15:8
- F. From Eliphas's experience he says about the wicked:
 - 1. They are the ones in pain 15:20
 - 2. They find terror 15:21
 - 3. They are destine for the sword 15:22
 - 4. They find anguish 15:24

- a. Because they have stretched out their hand against God 15:25
- b. Because they have becomes enemies with God 15:26 -Rushing into battle against Him.
- 5. They are outcasts 15:28
- 6. They won't be rich 15:29
- 7. And ultimately the wicked are deceptive 15:35

Chapter 22 (Third Speech)

- A. Your lack of reverence for God must be behind His judgments against you 22: 4 wrong
- B. Your wickedness is great and your sin is without end. 22:5 wrong
- C. You're a thief 22:6 wrong
 - 1. You have taken pledges from your brothers without cause
 - 2. You have neglected the thirsty and the hungry 22:7
 - 3. You have sent needy widows away empty and neglected orphans 22:9
- D. Job you need to yield to God and be at peace with Him 22:21
- E. Job 22:23 "If you return to the Almighty, you will be restored; If you remove unrighteousness far from your tent,"
- F. Job 22:24-25 Eliphaz says that Job should get rid of his gold and make God his gold.
 - 1. Then things will be good for you 22:26-30

 - 1. Example....Your son's got what they deserved 8:4

- C. If you make yourself upright God will restore your estate. 8:6
- D. You haven't learned from the past generations 8:8-10
- E. You have forgotten God 8:13 wrong
- F. God is rejecting you 8:20 wrong

Chapter 18

- A. You need to show some understanding 18:2
- B. You regard us as stupid 18:3

- C. Then Bildad describes the wicked 18:5-21
 - 1. They walk in darkness 18:5-6
 - a. Stumbling around
 - 2. Brought down by their own schemes. 18:7
 - 3. Their own feet have lead you into this net. 18:8
 - 4. They live in weakness 18:12
 - 5. Even their flesh is diseased 18:13
 - 6. They are forgotten by society 18:17
 - 7. They have no offspring 18:19
 - 8. And they don't know God. 18:21

Chapter 25:1-6

A. You are sinful because all men are sinful. We are basically maggots and worms.

- F. You can't hide sin from God 11:11
- G. You should direct your heart right and reach out to God 11:13
- H. Put sin away and clean your tent out 11:14
 - 1. 11:15-19 says if you put sin away you will have rest.

 - 3. I have become a joke to you 12:4
 - 4. Easy for those at ease to give answers 12:5
 - 5. I'm not inferior to you 12:3
 - 6. Your trying to unjustly, justify God 13:7
 - 7. Will it be well when God examines you? 13:9
 - 8. Your memorable sayings are like proverbs of ashes 13:12
 - 9. You are sorry comforters 16:2
 - 10. Your full of wind 16:3
 - 11. You torment me 19:2
 - 12. You insult me 19:3
 - 13. You friends are worthless 26:1-4
 - 14. You smear lies....your worthless physicians 13:4
 - 15. You guys need to just be quiet.

- * 8. I haven't erred 6:24

 - c. My wife finds my breath offensive 19:17
 - d. Young kids despise me 19:18
- 5. Pity me....Pity me 19:21
 - a. God has struck me
- 6. I know that my redeemer lives 19:25

Chapter 23 & 24

- 1. Here Job knows his complaint has went to far 23:2
 - a. Rebellion
- 2. I just want to sit and talk with God 23:3-4
 - a. Present my case

- b. Make argument to Him
- c. So I would learn His ways 23:5
- 3. When He has tried me I will come for as gold....refined 23:10
- 4. I have held to the path and treasured His words. 23:11-12
 - 5. Basically why does God not judge the wicked and come to the aid of the righteous? Chapter 24

Chapter 26-31

- 1. God is great 26:5-14
 - a. He establishes the north 26:7
 - b. He hangs the earth on nothing 26:7
 - c. He makes the clouds hold water 26:8
 - d. He sets the boundaries of light and darkness 26:10
- 2. I will hold fast my righteousness and not let it go 27:6
- 3. The godless have no hope 27:7-12
 - a. Their sons are destined for the sword 27:13-23
- 4. Man goes to great lengths to search for treasures of gold and silver, even turning the earth upside down. But man should search for wisdom Chapter 28
 - a. Wisdom is to fear the Lord 28:28

 - a. The widow
 - b. The orphans
 - c. The needy
- 6. I haven't put my confidence in gold 31:24
 - a. I haven't become prideful about my wealth 31:25
- 7. I haven't gloated even when my enemy falls
- * 8. Oh that I had one to hear me Let the Almighty answer me!
